"My Feral Heart" wins Award at World Premiere



It seems a long while since 'My Feral Heart' was being filmed in Stambridge. It was shot here because director Jane Gull (inset) knew Stambridge well (she attended Stambridge Primary School) and felt that the area would make a good setting for her first feature film.

The film had its World Premiere at the Cinequest Film Festival 2016 in San

Jose, California at the beginning of March. Last year Cinequest was voted 'America's Best Film Festival'.

'My Feral Heart' was one of only five British Films selected. Amongst the others were 'Eye in the Sky' starring Helen Mirren and the late Alan Rickman so the competition was stiff. However, the film **won the award for Best Narrative Drama**. This is chosen by the audience rather than a panel of judges. So Cinequest proved to be an excellent platform to introduce the film to the world and kick-start the film's festival run.



Stambridge Traffic Update

We all know that there has been much concern about traffic speeding through the village and along Stambridge Road. So your district Councillor, George Ioannou, raised these issues with the Highways panel who have surveyed some of the problem areas.

One of these is outside the Memorial Hall where the Mini Marvels Pre-School meets. A seven day speed survey was carried out and it was found that the *average* speeds were 43.7mph southbound and 42.3mph northbound.

Currently this stretch of road is subject to the national speed limit of 60 mph and the recorded speeds are far below this so compliance with

the speed limit is good. Lowering the speed limit would not have much effect on drivers' speeds as they would still drive to what they feel is safe in the circumstances and speeds recorded at just above 40mph do support this. The village hall is also set back away from the carriage way so this would also confuse drivers further if a speed limit change was to be put in place.

However, It is recommended that School warning signs be installed on both approaches to warn drivers of the location of the school as currently there are none. They are hoping to get funding for these in March.

Cllr. George Ioannou added, "In view of other requests, the Highways Dept. assure me that they are going to review all the traffic signs along Stambridge Road to make sure that drivers are aware of the speed limits."

A second area of concern is Church corner which joy-riders regularly take at excessive speeds and consequently quite often crash into walls. The 30mph speed limit is too fast for this tight corner and hopefully that, too, will be changed as a result of the survey being carried out. But it will need more drastic traffic calming measures to stop the accidents. Several possibilities are being considered but if residents have any suggestions we would love to hear them. Stambridge Past Barton Hall

Barton Hall now refers to a pair of semi-detached houses, at the eastern end of the parish overlooking Bartonhall Creek. But when William the Conqueror invaded Britain, there was a Manor there and Barton Hall was the Manor



House. After the Norman Conquest, William gave this Manor to one of the Norman knights who had fought with him at the Battle

Near the site of Barton Hall of Hastings.

In due course, the knight's son, Richard, inherited Barton Hall. He had other properties but he found Stambridge a convenient place to live as he spent much of his time at the court of Henry II where he was a close friend and confidante of the King's brother, Prince William. The Royal Forest of Essex included Stambridge and frequently the King, with Prince William, and their courtiers would hunt this way, passing the night in the conveniently situated, out -of-the-way, Barton Hall.

Your Village Needs You

There are vacancies for three councillors on the Stambridge Parish Council and maybe you should be one of them.



The main task of a councillor is to turn up at the monthly council meetings. That is where most of the decisions are made. Apart from

hearing reports from other organisations, top of the list come financial matters, for spending needs to be tightly controlled. But the council is responsible for a number of things: the Memorial Hall and grounds, allotments, bus shelters, the parish website, a Newsletter and more.

But there are also many projects aiming to improve the community. These include Neighbourhood Watch, Speed Watch, the Fisheries Programme for youngsters and the rest. We don't run them ourselves but setting them up and monitoring does take time.

How much time? It depends very much on the circumstances of individual councillors but about two hours a week is considered typical.

Your party politics, if any, are not relevant here (though you do have to declare them) and neither is age important. Younger people usually bring enthusiasm and energy whilst older people have learned much from experience. Sometimes. However you do need an internet connection and to be comfortable with email as we use it a lot.

Free Disability Sports Sessions

Transparency Code

From July, the government will require us to publish on-line information which they believe "will provide taxpayers with a clear picture of the council's' activities, spending and governance and will improve the ability of communities interaction with the local public bodies". In plain language, for you to know what we are up to.

Most of the information they require is on our website already and has been for some time. For example, we already publish Minutes and agendas of council meetings, the annual internal audit report and end of year accounts. But there is some information we will have to add such as details



of all items of expenditure above ± 100 and a list of councillors' responsibilities.

We cannot promise, however, that it will be as addictive as the image suggests, though we will do our best.

What plane *IS* that?

Most people in Stambridge can see aircraft heading in and out of Southend Airport as the flight path goes right over the village.

The easyJet planes are easy to spot. The flashes of orange are usually enough, and the word 'easyJet' in huge letters on the fuselage is also a bit if a clue. But, in fact, you are quite likely to see another type of plane. It will almost certainly be operated by Stobart Air on behalf of FlyBe but they don't all have the FlyBe livery. The shape of the plane is fairly distinctive however.

Stobart Air is an Irish airline and is part of the group that owns

Southend Airport. They operate planes on behalf of both FlyBe and Aer Lingus Regional.

ATR, whose planes are assembled in France, specialise in building aircraft for relatively short distances and they are used in many parts of the world. A smaller version of this plane, the ATR 42, used to fly between Dublin and Southend by Aer Lingus Regional but that service has been discontinued.

This in turn supports the children in learning effectively through play with adult support to guide and enhance their development in all areas of the Early Years Foundation Stages.

The preschool meets Monday to Friday between 9.15am and 12.15pm and Monday to Thursday between 1.30pm and 4.30pm during term time and offers an optional lunch club from 12.30 to 1.15 Monday to Thursday at an additional cost of £4.00 per day.
